#### HANDICAPPER'S MESSAGE

It has been a solid year for the Roseville Golf Club in 2003. The course is in better shape than it has been in many years and that has made our tournaments not only more enjoyable to the participants, but has helped to speed up play. My job has been a fairly easy one this year, especially at home tournaments where I get to input the score. The away tournaments have been a bit more of a trial with many calls regarding, "I forgot to input the score as a Tournament, what do I do?" or "I forgot to adjust my score for Equitable Stroke Control, how do I fix that?" or my favorite, "I got drunk and forgot to post, what do I do?" For the away tournament golfers, I'd encourage you to post your scores **before** entering the bar in the future. For those of you who don't heed that advice, give me a call and I'll fix your mess.

I've enjoyed this year and have seen many new faces out at our tournaments as well as some of the same suspects (Dick McDonough, Club Champion). The goal of your club leadership is to provide a competitive, yet fun experience for tournament golfers here in Roseville and at our away tournaments. I think we have succeeded in that goal and I'm proud to be a part of this club. It has always been the best golf club in Roseville and at age 38 it is only getting better.

I'd like to thank Neil Thomas and Gary Krohn for their help as my assistants this year. Neil joined me at Whitney Oaks for the Handicap Seminar in May and has been invaluable this year. As a reminder, here is the Equitable Stroke Control table for your reference. I'll see you on the course.

#### **Equitable Stroke Control**

Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) is a procedure whereby abnormally high individual hole scores are adjusted downward prior to the score being posted. ESC sets a maximum number that a golfer can post on any hole, depending on the golfer's Course Handicap (not his Handicap Index). Effective Feb. 1, 1998, individual hole scores will be adjusted for handicap purposes per the following table:

Course Handicap	Maximum Number on Any Hole
9 or less	Double bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10
