Handicapper's Message

Hi everybody,

When you receive your email from NCGA each month showing your Handicap Index, you will notice one column with "diff." on top. This is your Handicap Differential. The USGA Handicap System Manual defines it as follows:

"Handicap Differential" is the difference between a player's adjusted gross score and the USGA Course Rating of the course on which the score was made, multiplied by 113, then divided by the Slope Rating from the tees played and rounded to the nearest tenth. A Handicap Differential is a number rounded to one decimal place, e.g. 12.8.

What does this mean? For example, let's say you shoot an 85 at Diamond Oaks from the blue tees. The blue tees at Diamond Oaks have a Course Rating of 69.1 and a Slope Rating of 118. So, in this example, take your adjusted gross score of 85 and subtract 69.1, multiply by 113, then divide by 118 leaving you a differential of 15.2. Your ten lowest Handicap Differentials are used in a formula to determine your Handicap Index.

I also would like to thank Rick Rusk and Doug Smith for handling the posting of scores for tournaments when I was filling in as Tournament Director.
