Handicapper's Message

This may sound like a broken record (For you younger members, this was a vinyl disc that played on a turntable and when there was a scratch on the record it would repeat over and over). Anyway, to get back on the subject, I need to repeat myself. We still have members that are confused about the Equitable Score Control (ESC for short). Basically, if you have a single digit course handicap, the most strokes you can take on a hole for

posting purposes is a double bogey. If your course handicap is 10 - 19, your maximum posting score is a "7" (no matter what par is for the hole). If your course handicap is 20 - 29, your maximum posting score is an "8". And, if your course handicap is 30 and higher, your maximum posting score is a "9".

Also, it has come to my attention that some members are not posting all their scores when they play casual rounds. Please post all your scores. The handicap system was designed to make golf equitable for all players. By not posting all your rounds, you are not only being unfair to yourself but to your fellow players also.

Rules Chairman

A Change in Degree

Summer has arrived, and while the blistering heat of summer has not hit us yet, we know that change is on its way. Did someone say change? What would golf be without the realization that we all must play in the 100's? Did someone say degrees?

Yes, this is about change, and I can say with some degree of confidence that almost all of you read the new local rules and my recent message to the members concerning the two major changes to the local rules. Right? If you missed it or if you suffer from the dreaded CRS, here it is again. To most of you this will seem like needless repetition. To the one person who would be unnecessarily unhappy when they were penalized because they didn't know, it is important.

The first change is the addition of free relief from immovable obstructions close to the putting green. This local rule was adopted prior to the revision, but was unfortunately omitted from the printed version. There is often confusion about the Rules of Golf and suggested local rules such as this one. The many sprinkler heads near the greens at Diamond Oaks make this a logical suggestion to adopt.

If a ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and an immovable obstruction on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief without penalty. The ball must be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay that (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids intervention and (c) is not in a hazard or on a putting green. The ball may be cleaned when lifted.

The second deals with the interior maintenance area, adjacent to the driving range and between holes #1 and #8. There has been considerable discussion concerning this area and its previous status of an area of Ground Under Repair with free relief. While some of us feel that this previous status was fair and warranted, the vagueness of its boundary, the disagreement concerning the proper place to drop a ball, and new staking by course management has made the GUR designation unworkable.

The interior maintenance yard marked with white stakes, adjacent to the driving range, between holes #1 and #8 is defined as Out of Bounds as marked. For a ball that may be Out of Bounds, the player should play a provisional ball in accordance with Rule 27-1.

If the original ball is found to be Out of Bounds, the player shall continue with the provisional ball under penalty of stroke and distance.

It is an exceptional experience working with the members of RGC. I sincerely enjoy the opportunity to be your Rules Chair, and I look forward to continuing to answer your questions and to help you improve your own knowledge of the rules.
