Yes, I said 13 years old. He won the trophy for 12-13 Boys. Austen Murphy won honors for the 10-11 Boys beating Jason Smith on a scorecard tiebreaker. Both boys shot 40 playing the front nine from the red tees. One to watch is 9-year-old Patrick Welch who shot 41 for nine holes from the red tees.

The girls also played some fantastic golf. Samantha Stockton (16) shot 72 from the red tees to win the 15-17 Girls' first place trophy. The Overall Girls winner was 14-year-old Paige Lee who shot a 2 under par 71. Natalie Pietromonaco had the low round for the 11 and under girls with a nine-hole score of 49.

As a footnote, the David Oxley Tournament has been run by the RGC since its inception 42 years ago. We still have active members of the club that established the tournament have been there every year doing everything they can to keep this one of the best youth tournaments in Northern California. Tournament Bookkeeper's Message



The tournament fund is in good financial shape and I appreciate your timely entries into the RGC tournaments. And most of you (but not all) have attached entry slips along with your payments which is extremely important especially when making cash payments. Please remember one entry slip for EACH tournament. Entry slips are available on the Web Page, in the Pro Shop, or in the Men's Restroom.

It is important that you sign up for each tournament as soon as possible because we have a limited number of tee times available for each tournament. If we know early enough that the number of golfers entering the tournament exceeds our estimate, we MAY be able to obtain additional tee times

from the pro shop. But if you wait until the due date (normally at 6:00 p.m. on the Friday a week before each home tournament play date) you run the risk of not being able to play in that tournament. Who doesn't play is based on when I receive your entry. The later your entry is received increases the possibility that you may not be able to play. So my best advice to you is sign up early!

Also, please be aware that entries received AFTER the published due date and time will not be accepted.

We make every attempt to post the tournament results as soon after the tournament concludes as we can. Once the results are posted on the website I allow 3 to 5 days before I pay the golf course and the amounts are posted to your individual accounts. This is done to allow golfers who played in the tournament to appeal the results. Sometimes, errors are made and we want the results to be accurate before we pay the golf course because after we pay the prize fund it's difficult to make corrections. So it's extremely important that once the results are posted on the website that you bring any errors to the attention of the Tournament Director immediately.

Once the tournament results are deemed accurate I "fund" the tournament. I give the pro shop an alphabetical listing of the golfers that have won money in the tournament. It is the pro shop's responsibility to properly post the amount to your individual account. In the past there have been some errors in this posting procedure. It is your responsibility to periodically check your individual account to ensure the proper monetary amount has been posted. Bring any discrepancies to the attention of the pro shop staff and myself immediately. The sooner you bring the discrepancy to our attention increases the likelihood of a satisfactory resolution.

A number of golfers still have unredeemed prizes/refunds coming to them. While I try to catch you on tournament days some of you have not played in many tournaments or haven't checked with me at the conclusion of your round to claim your prize/refund.

At every home tournament a list of all golfers who are due a prize or a refund and are playing in that particular days tournament is posted next to the scoring sheets listing. So please check the Bulletin Board before your round and if your name is listed, see me (or my designee) at the conclusion of your round to receive your prize/refund.

The following golfers have prizes coming to them which are over 6 months old. Please e-mail me at (<u>Corney1@Starstream.net</u>) and let me know how I can get your prizes to you. If I don't receive instructions from you by August 31, 2009, the funds will be deposited in the Tournament Fund to be used in future tournaments.
