### Secretary's message



Well it is renewal time again. As of October 1<sup>st</sup>, we can start adding new members and they can play in the remaining tournaments for 2009 and all of the 2010 tournaments. We had a dues increase from NCGA this year. Although they are charging an additional \$6 per member per year, we held the costs to a \$5 increase across the board with the exception of Junior's where they are now charging us \$18 each now. New members can also get some required rounds in for the NCGA Qualifying events coming up next year as well. Remember, join now, or join later, the membership is only good for the calendar year. If you have a friend that has been thinking about joining, now is the time to follow through. For those of you that pay for the Diamond Membership level, please see the Pro shop to get your member packet for that level.

With the larger membership base, and all of the payment options, Paul and I have had a very busy year. Please note the following and keep it in mind when you renew or pay for other events:

- ✓ If you pay by check, please make the payments for like items and don't combine them into one large payment. Tournament funds go to a different fund and it makes it difficult to keep track and transfer payments back and forth between accounts. You can pay for more than one tournament at a time, or you can pay for multiple memberships with one check, and also a number of Christmas party reservations with a single check, but please don't combine them all into one payment.
- ✓ Please renew early and keep track of your payment. Remember, there is a significant discount for renewing before the November 30<sup>th</sup> deadline. Around the end of November there will be a reminder to renew. If you renewed early and receive a call, please let me know so I can check your status to make sure the application did not get missed. There were some problems with Pay Pal last year that took some time to sort out as well as payments to the Pro Shop that were filed before I processed them.

✓ Please fill out your application in full. There are sometimes changes in phone, email, and address listings, and we need to verify that our current information is correct. Make sure you can receive email at the email address you give us. We get quite a few kickbacks from business addresses.

### Handicapper's Message



When you receive your email from NCGA each month showing your Handicap Index, you will notice one column with "diff." on top. This is your Handicap Differential. The USGA Handicap System Manual defines it as follows:

"Handicap Differential" is the difference between a player's adjusted gross score and the USGA Course Rating of the course on which the score was made, multiplied by 113, then divided by the Slope Rating from the tees played and rounded to the nearest tenth. A Handicap Differential is a number rounded to one decimal place, e.g. 12.8.

What does this mean? For example, let's say you shoot an 85 at Diamond Oaks from the blue tees. The blue tees at Diamond Oaks have a Course Rating of 69.4 and a Slope Rating of 122. So, in this example, take your adjusted gross score of 85 and subtract 69.4, multiply by 113, then divide by 122 leaving you a

differential of 14.4. Your ten lowest Handicap Differentials are used in a formula to determine your Handicap Index.

I also would like to remind you that there still are three Eclectic events to play this year.

### **Tournament Bookkeeper's Message**



The tournament fund is in good financial shape and I appreciate your timely entries into the RGC tournaments. And most of you (but not all) have attached entry slips along with your payments which is extremely important especially when making cash payments. Please remember one entry slip for EACH tournament. Entry slips are available in the pro shop or in the Men's Restroom.

It is important that you sign up for each tournament as soon as possible because we have a limited number of tee times available for each tournament. If we know early enough that the number of golfers entering the tournament exceeds our estimate, we MAY be able to obtain additional tee times from the pro shop. But if you wait until the due date (normally at 6:00 p.m. on the Friday a week before each home tournament play date) you run the risk of not being able to play in that tournament. Who doesn't play is based on when I receive your entry. The later your entry is received increases the possibility that you may not be able to play. So my best advice to you is sign up early!

#### Also, please be aware that entries received AFTER the published due date and time will not be accepted.

We make every attempt to post the tournament results as soon after the tournament concludes as we can. Once the results are posted on the website I allow 3 to 5 days before I pay the golf course and the amounts are posted to your individual accounts. This is done to allow golfers who played in the tournament to appeal the results. Sometimes, errors are made and we want the results to be accurate before we pay the golf course because after we pay the prize fund it's difficult to make corrections. So it's extremely important that once the results are posted on the website that you bring any errors to the attention of the Tournament Director immediately.

Once the tournament results are deemed accurate I "fund" the tournament. I give the pro shop an alphabetical listing of the golfers that have won money in the tournament. It is the pro shop's responsibility to properly post the amount to your individual account. In the past there have been some errors in this posting procedure. It is your responsibility to periodically check your individual account to ensure the proper monetary amount has been posted. Bring any discrepancies to the attention of the pro shop staff and myself immediately. The sooner you bring the discrepancy to our attention increases the likelihood of a satisfactory resolution.

A number of golfers still have unredeemed prizes/refunds coming to them. While I try to catch you on tournament days some of you have not played in many tournaments or haven't checked with me at the conclusion of your round to claim your prize/refund.

At every home tournament a list is posted next to the scoring sheets listing all golfers who are due a prize or a refund who are playing in that particular days tournament. So please check the Bulletin Board before your round and if your name is listed, see me (or my designee) at the conclusion of your round to receive your prize/refund.

The following golfer has a prize coming to him which is over 6 months old. Please e-mail me at (<u>Corney1@Starstream.net</u>) and let me know how I can get your prize to you. If I don't receive instructions from you by November 30th, 2009, the funds will be deposited in the Tournament Fund to be used in future tournaments.
