Tournament Director's Message



Two thousand thirteen was a year we will all remember, some of us with sadness at the loss of some of our members and yet others will remember it with joy in remembering that they played some of their finest rounds ever.

In two thousand fourteen we will welcome in a new RGC Board of Directors that will include Bryan Lange (President), Jesse Sierra (Vice President), Paul Christianson (Treasurer), Chuck Heath (Secretary), Rick Rusk (Rules Chairman), Tim Bryan (Tournament Bookkeeper / Second Past President), Ken Lyon (Handicap Chairman), Steve Ries (Webmaster), Dick Hunt (First Past President), Bob Mitchell, Matt Eidsvoog, Paul Gonzalez, and Russ Tabbert (Members-at-Large), and myself.

Our Tournament schedule, found elsewhere in this newsletter, will include away tournaments at Somersett Golf and Country Club, and Wolf Run in the Reno area. We will play a tournament at Ancil Hoffman in May and in October we will return to Poppy Hills and its long awaited revamping. The day after that, we will once again play Pacific Grove golf links. We will also schedule the popular Day on the Oaks weekday events, in June, July, August, and September.

Also in 2014, in the spirit of the N.C.G.A.'s "Tee it Forward", the club will allow all male members to play from the Blue or White tees in tournaments if they so desire, regardless of their age. However, you must indicate your preference to me at the beginning of the year. Whatever tees you designate, you must play from those tees for the remainder of the year where RGC competition allows. Switching tee preferences from tournament to tournament will not be allowed. There are exceptions, such as in the Club Championship Tournament where all players competing in the first or Championship Flight, must play from the "Blue" tees (see the tournament guide). Women shall play from the White or Red tees where allowed. If you do not designate what tees you wish to play from, then my assumption will be that you wish to play from the Blue tees for men and Red tees for women. Men will not be allowed to play from the Red tees in RGC tournaments. On the schedule this year you will notice the return of the 3-Club tournament. In this event a player will play the entire 18 holes tournament with the same 3 clubs. Only three clubs can be carried in the bag, so choose your clubs wisely. Also, the format of the Memorial tournament has been changed. We will play holes 1 through 6 under the Better Ball format, and holes 7 through 12, under the Modified Chapman format, and holes 13 through 18 under a Scramble format.

It is always a challenge trying to get everyone into a tournament and I would like to thank all of our members who observed the tournament "Due Dates". Those who choose not to enter by the due date can expect to be put on a standby list with no guarantee that they can play, so sign up early. Those who withdraw from a tournament or event must give the tournament chairman advanced notice of at least 24 hours so that he can have time to contact players on the standby list and hopefully fill the vacated time.

Thank you all for your cooperation as we look forward to another great year.

That means that I have received your entry and have placed you in the tournament.

Rules Chair Message



Welcome to the 2014 RGC golf season. I am pleased to serve as your Rules Chair for another year. Our committee includes Dick Hunt, Frieda Aichele, Gary Krohn, Ken Lyon, Charlie Aichele and Jesse Sierra. Our purpose is to help you interpret rules during tournaments to avoid penalties and maintain the integrity of the game.

Our Tournament Director, Neil Thomas, highlights the names of Rules Committee members in the tee times to help identify us. We are typically spread out though the tee times so one of us is in or near your tee time. We will try to resolve your

rules questions immediately or instruct you to play a second ball. In the absence of a rules person on the course you should play a second ball when in doubt and we will make a determination at the end of your round before you sign your scorecard.

Our slow play rule will continue to be in force unless otherwise noted (e.g. shotgun starts). You are expected to finish your round in 4 hours and 40 minutes or finish no more than 15 minutes behind the group in front of you. Your group will be penalized 2 strokes per player if you violate both of these provisions. This rule has been a tremendous help keeping play moving and making the game more enjoyable.
