HANDICAP CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

The NCGA qualifying events are in full swing. We have the 54 hole Individual Championship in May as well as the NCGA Senior 4 ball. Players continue to move to the white tees and many have said they are enjoying playing the course more from the closer tees. I want to remind all golfers that I will post all scores in RGC events and that all event scores will be posted as Home scores, except for the 5 majors that we play. Those event will be posted as Tournaments and those are: NCGA Zone Qualifier, 4 Ball Qualifier, Senior 4 Ball qualifier, 54 hole Individual (all three days), and the NCGA Net Amateur. I was informed in discussions with the NCGA that the Roseville Golf Club was designating too many events as Tournament scores. Most clubs only use their major events and NCGA qualifiers as Tournament scores and it was decided by

the board that we would designate the above tournaments as eligible Tournament scores. All scores posted in RGC events will still be used in the computation of the Tournament Handicaps that are posted on our website. This change will only affect how the scores are reported to the NCGA and has nothing to do with our Tournament Handicaps or status of any events on the Tournament schedule. This simply brings us into alignment with NCGA practices.

The Eclectic yearlong tournament has completed its second event and the results to date can be seen on the website. At the moment we have 46 players in the Eclectic event. It is not too late to sign up. The 54 hole individual stroke play event mentioned above will give you the opportunity to get 3 rounds in on your Eclectic scorecard. Throughout the year Steve Ries and I will track your best scores on each of the 18 holes at Diamond Oaks in each eligible stroke play event. These events are listed in the Tournament schedule and are highlighted in red. It is a fun and interesting event and you can see how well you do overall on each hole at Diamond Oaks throughout the year. I will track your scores once you sign up, but will not go back to past events, so sign up early.

Charlie Aichele's twilight league will start in April and it is always a fun way to spend Spring and Summer evenings during the work week. I encourage each of you to come out and play some golf with us soon. For those of you who are long term members, Steve Parino has signed up again and will be joining the Twilight group. He has been on IR for almost five years and the Handicap committee is working on a Medical Exemption for Steve. The course is in great shape and life is good on the golf course. I will see you out there.

RULES COMMITTEE MESSAGE

April is here. Bring out the shorts and sunscreen. It is time to play golf.

Every year your RGC Board looks for ways to improve our experience on the course, and pace of play is always an item on the forefront. This year is no exception. On January 1, 2016 our Pace of Play rule was revised. The playing time to complete a round at Diamond Oaks was reduced by 10 minutes to 4 hours 30 minutes. While we have been very successful in achieving this goal up to this point, some reminders can always be helpful:

Playing at a better pace is not about hurrying up or rushing around the course. It is simply about being more efficient with your time. Adopting this mindset can only add enjoyment to your golf experience.

Unless the format is match play, play ready golf -

Don't wait to play your shot just because you are closer to the hole.

Keep your pre-shot routine short -

Determine your vardage and make your club selection while others are playing.

Pick your line of play and trust yourself. Take no more than one practice swing. Be ready to hit when it is your turn.

Aim to play in 30 seconds -

From club selection to pre-shot routine to execution. Keep play moving at a brisk pace.

When sharing a cart, use a buddy system -

Don't wait in the cart while your cart-mate hits and then drive to your ball. If your ball lies a reasonable distance away, get out and walk to your ball with a few clubs, and let your cart-mate pick you up. Or, drive to your ball after you drop your cart-mate off and then pick him or her up after you hit. Replace your clubs and equipment in your bag while others are preparing to play and not immediately when returning to the cart.

Be helpful to others in your group -

Follow the flight of all tee shots, not just your own. Help others look for their ball if you already know the location of yours. Be ready to fill a divot, rake a bunker or tend the flagstick for others.

Keep up with the group in front of you -

Your correct position on the course is immediately behind the group in front of you, **not** immediately in front of the group behind you.

Be efficient on the putting green -

Mark your ball and lift and clean it when you arrive at the putting green so you will be ready to replace it when it is your turn to play. Line up your putt while others are putting. Leave the green promptly after everyone in your group has holed out. Wait until arriving at the next tee to record the scores.

While these are simple suggestions that we all may consider to be things that we always do, keeping them in mind and not being afraid to share them with your fellow players will ultimately make the golf experience more enjoyable for all of us.
