RULES CHAIRPERSON

It's time for some fall golf, it will be nice to finally get some cooler weather. I would like to mention a couple rules that everyone may not understand and that have actually come up this year in tournament play.

6.2b, specifically the restrictions on moving teeing markers. The tee markers are set by the tournament director and can not be moved to improve your stance. This is a general penalty (2 stroke penalty) if the markers are accidentally moved, for example you trip over one, they just need to be replaced no penalty.

The other rule is 15.2a. A players ball came to rest up against a rake near a bunker. Under the rules you are allowed to move the obstruction with no penalty.

The ball rolls off the top of the slope down the hill to a much better lie. The player wanted to play it where it came to rest, but under the rule it must be placed back in its original position prior to moving the rake.

Have a great rest of the year and as always, hit it long and straight.

HANDICAPPER'S MESSAGE



Hi everybody, not only am I the Handicap Chairperson but I'm also the Club Ambassador so I am wearing two hats.

Starting January 1, 2020, GHIN will no longer exist. It will be replaced by the World Handicap System (WHS). WHS is combination of USGA and five other associations around the world. A couple of changes you will see:

Handicap indexes will be calculated from the best 8 out of 20 scores. Under the old system, it was 10 out of 20.

Net Double Bogey will be maximum hole score for posting. This replaces Equitable Score Control.

Course condition adjustments that considers the impact of abnormal course and weather conditions might have on a player's performance each day.

Handicaps will be revised daily instead of twice a month.

The maximum handicap index will be 54.0 regardless of gender.

More information will be coming.
