## SECRETARY'S MESSAGE



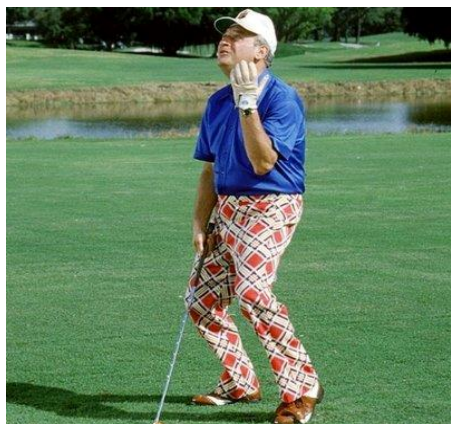

Based on the list of players provided by the Tournament Bookkeeper, I create the tee sheets for all events. So, if you would like an earlier tee time get your entries in early. If you ever need an early or late time specifically, please notify me when you submit your entry and I will try to accommodate you. Some of the major tournaments require that your tee time is based on score, and I probably will not be able to accommodate you for those tournaments.

We will be using a new program for Tournament Management called Blue Golf. We are following the lead of the NCGA as they are also using that new program.

## HANDICAPPER'S REPORT



Happy New Year everybody, I am the Handicap Chairperson and the Club Ambassador. I have a couple of reminders for all the members:

It is very important that you post the day that you play before midnight. There is a feature that factors in weather and course condition variables. The automated Playing Conditions Calculator (PCC) will analyze scores to determine if conditions of play differed significantly from "normal" to an extent that scoring was impacted. If so, all differentials for the day will be uniformly adjusted upwards or downwards. The calculation is performed each evening just before handicaps are updated. If a golfer delays posting, the score will inherit any PCC adjustment but will not be included in the calculation.

This is a reminder that all tournament scores are posted by the Handicap Committee. Please notify the Tournament Director and Handicap Chairperson if you wish to change to Blue, Palmer or White Tees.

If you are wondering about tournament handicaps, there will be a text file on the website showing the last ten of all members' posted scores. If they are prior to January 1, 2020, those scores will not be used in the calculation. Tournament Handicap differentials used to calculate your Tournament Handicap Index are calculated by using the Diff numbers with "Yes" next to them. Add up the numbers under Diff with "Yes" next to them and divide that by the number of "Yeses" (2 – 4). The result is your Tournament Handicap Index. You then may take that index and look up the Course Handicap here <https://www.usga.org/course-handicap-calculator.html>.

In the example below, here is the calculation:  
 $29.1+29.1+21.7+18.9 = 98.8$   $98.8/4 = 24.7$  Access the link above and it shows 24.7 from the Blue Tees has a Course Handicap of 24.

## **RULES CHAIRPERSON**



Happy New Year!

We are looking forward to an exciting 2022 Tournament schedule . The USGA has not made any changes to the rules of golf for the coming year. I did complete the revisions of the RGC Local Rules to bring them in line with our current playing procedures and Diamond Oaks playing conditions. These are posted on our website and on the DO men's bathroom bulletin board. Below are a couple of changes that I wanted to point out: Obstructions - Hole #18- Relief for an unplayable lie against the back fence. In the past, we have painted a blue drop zone off to the side. However, the turf conditions and the tree cover have changed the situation. So now you may drop for relief from the fence towards the green. This will be closer to the hole. However, it will still cost you a stroke and is an easy process to perform. You always have the option to go back and replay the last shot.

- Abnormal Couse Conditions-
  - #4 – Temporary water
  - Relief for ball lost in leaves.
  - Tree trunk on #16/17

Many questions can be answered during a round within your foursome, if everyone has read the Local Rules. Please take 5 minutes and review your club rules. And if a question does arise, make sure to bring it to my attention before you sign your scorecards. Have a great year and hit them straight!
