HANDICAPPER'S REPORT



Hello everyone,

I hope your golf season is going well, hard to believe it's going by so quickly. I would like to share with you that the Eclectic scores have all been updated on an excel spreadsheet and should be posted on our website by now. We had to go back to a manual system as Blue Golf was not working on the net score side.

Every round that a players handicap changed would affect all previous rounds scores. For instance, if you were a 12 early in the year and you birdied the 12th handicap hole you would have a net eagle. If your handicap went down to an 11 later on, you then lost that previous net eagle, and it would now just be a birdie. That being said, Gary Krohn was kind enough to share his spreadsheet with us. Thank you Gary, and I modified it to make it easier on myself to get it out to the field quicker. There used to be a gross spreadsheet and a net spreadsheet, but I have incorporated the 2 into 1 spreadsheet. If you look at the sheet now there are 2 cover sheets (1 gross, 1net) that shows where everyone is sitting currently. Each player also has an individual sheet that shows every round he's played with both the gross and net scores. I thank you all in for you patience as it was quite time consuming to modify the sheet and then input 16 tournaments. I hope you all enjoy it and hope to see you all out on the course competing real soon!

RULES CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT



Thanks to all of you, there have been very few rule violations this year!

If there is a questionable situation on the course, it's always best to check with your group before playing. If there is uncertainty about how to play, please play two balls, and then a rules determination can be made later. As much as possible, we should make those decisions on the course.

We did have an unfortunate situation at our away Lakeridge tournament. One group used the incorrect tee box on a par three. If they would have recognized the error before playing the next hole and gone back and replayed from the correct tee box, there would have been a two-stroke penalty. Unfortunately, the error was not discovered until later and the entire group was disqualified.

We have not had any penalties for slow play. Keep up the great work. We always play ready golf so don't wait to hit if you are ready to play.

Here are a couple of reminders about abnormal ground conditions from our Local Rules established by the club in 2022:

b) Bunkers, ball is in casual water, player may take free relief inside bunker under Rule 16.1c (1) OR for one penalty stroke, outside bunker on the reference line straight back from the hole thru the spot of the ball under Rule 16.1C (2) . (This happens in the summer at times due to watering issues)

c) Old, uneven cup holes on the Putting Greens. The player may move the ball to the nearest point of relief, on the green, no closer to the hole.

As always, if you have any questions regarding the rules of golf, please don't hesitate to contact me. Enjoy the second half of this year's golf schedule.
