




SECRETARY'S MESSAGE

Hello everyone, we are well in to the new year. As of March 30th, we have 273 active members. Six of those are junior members. If you have any problems getting your club mail or NCGA news, please let me know. I maintain the address and phone lists as well as the membership portion of the computer at Diamond Oaks Golf Course. Eclectic tournament: You may have noticed that the first tournament of the year is called the “Eclectic Tournament”. If you plan to play in a number of tournaments played at Diamond Oaks this year, this event might be of interest to you. What is it? We keep a record of your scores on all of the medal play tournaments played at Diamond Oaks over the course of the year. Twelve play dates qualify as Eclectic events this year. In December we take the best score you've made on each hole during those qualifying events, add the total and then subtract your December 2004 handicap. A low gross and a low net winner will be selected overall, and then the rest of the players will be divided into flights, just as in a normal tournament. Eclectic tournaments are usually designated on the schedule by red ink, italics or shading to make them stand out. You can get in at any time. The RGC masters is the second tournament for Eclectic, and all three rounds of the 54 hole individual tournament count towards your eclectic total for the year. As long as you sign up on the day of any of these tournaments, the scores for that day and any future eclectic events will count—sorry, we cannot go back and capture scores for rounds already played.

We have had a good start to the year. A scheduling mishap at the Mather tournament caused a headache for some of the members but the tournament did go off on the corrected day and was a success. Superbowl had a great turnout, as did the 54-hole team event. The Zone qualifier was very close and had two days of great scoring and I wish the two qualifying teams luck as they go down to represent our club.

Upcoming events include the Twilight league meeting on Wednesday April 6th which will give you all the information you need for the Twilight league, a NEW event on Saturday April 9th called the RGC masters which is a stroke play event. We also have our open meeting on Thursday April 14th and finally the 4-Ball net Qualifier on Saturday April 23rd.

We will be having a senior division for the 4-ball based on a very positive response from the club. You can sign-up for the senior division if you are the age of 55 by August 25th. You do not need to sign-up for the senior division if you do not want to. The 4-ball is a two person net better ball event. We will be using 90% of the men's handicap and 95% of the women's using a max index of 18.4. NOTE: If partners' handicaps differ more than 8 strokes an additional 10% reduction will be applied to your course handicaps.

Future events include the 54 hole individual 5/7, 5/14 and 5/15, the net-am 5/11, Castle Oaks 5/18 and The David Oxley on 5/13 which we will need volunteers for so please come out and support our juniors if you can. The starter table has been working out great. I have a new tournament assistant sign-up sheet for different ways you can assist the club at future events. Please give it a look and if you can sign-up and help.

Let's keep the pace of play in our minds at all times and keep up the good work. Thanks for all the fun and let's have a great summer of golf. See you out there.

On March 16th, Gary Krohn, Chuck Heath and I attended the “Report-less” seminar put on by the N.C.G.A. Big changes are in store for all of us. Effective April 1st, G.H.I.N. will suspend shipping of all monthly reports and handicap stickers. Individual Clubs will now be able to generate these reports themselves. Beginning in June a player will be able to play golf on the morning of the last day of the month (June 30th) and post that score, and it will be posted and can be seen on July 1st.

Your scores and your current index can be reviewed on the N.C.G.A. website or have it e-mailed to you at your web address. The N.C.G.A. is now taking steps so that your current index can be viewed on any computer screen at any N.C.G.A. golf course. Computers are changing everything and golf is no exception.

I realize that there are members in our club who do not have computers. We are working on some ideas as to how to satisfy these members’ needs.
