The biggest issue year to date on the Handicapping side has been the use of a Medical Handicap in RGC events. The Tournament Committee has taken this under advisement and we will have a recommendation for the board soon. I think the situation that occurred was a "one off" event, but we wanted to protect all of the golfers in the future from a rapidly declining handicap eventuated under the terms of a medically exempted handicap. There will be more to come on this issue at the July Open meeting.

It has been a good golf year to date and the yearlong Eclectic event has seen some of the lowest scores at this time of year that I can ever remember. There is some very good and consistent golf being played by our members.

Now that the David Oxley event is concluded for the year, I want to bring to the membership's attention a national Junior Golf event that is taking place at Del Paso Country Club on August 1-4th. The Trusted Choice National Junior Golf Championship will bring the BEST junior golfers from around the country to Sacramento. This will be a 72-hole event with a 36 hole cut. The tournament has had past champions the likes of Tiger Woods, Justin Leonard, Grace Park and our very own Austin Smotherman . The committee has reached out to golf clubs across the region for volunteers as it takes 100's of volunteers to run a huge event like this. The volunteer page is:

RULES COMMITTEE MESSAGE

100 degrees - IT'S HOT!

"It's hot" can refer to a number of things - a surface to the touch, a person passing by, the weather, or even one's momentary temperament. With the temperatures high, we may find our tempers rising, and a reminder about the integrity of our game and the conduct and sportsmanship we expect of each other may be in order.

Golf is played without the supervision of a referee or umpire. The game relies on the integrity, honesty and respectfulness of the individual to show consideration for other players, to care for the course and its employees, and to conduct ourselves in a manner that demonstrates courtesy and sportsmanship at all times. This is the spirit of the game of Golf. Proper conduct differs from rules in that it addresses behavior, and good behavior ensures a fun and friendly competition.

Keep these things in mind while out on the course or enjoying the after party:

- NEVER cheat shaving or adding strokes will catch up with you.
- DON'T throw clubs they may hit someone or break and this will cost you money.
- DON'T abuse your golf course an unnecessary divot in the green takes a long time to heal. Remember that this is your golf course.
- DO Respect another player's turn to play. your conversation IS interfering with their shot.
- DON'T use language that may be offensive to those you are with. what one person thinks is OK, another may find abusive.
- DON'T abuse alcohol on the course. too much to drink will make your speech slur and may make your shot go astray.
- ALWAYS respect golf course employees. they are doing their job.
- ALWAYS respect your club volunteers. they are working to make your event a success.
