HANDICAP CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



Handicappers Report

20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

I always include the ESC table in my reports in the hope that you are all using it and adjusting your scores before posting them.

Sometimes my Newsletter articles write themselves and such was the case last month when a long time member contacted me regarding his handicap in an event. He was confused about why his GHIN handicap was one number, but his Course Handicap for the event was lower. I explained it to him and he was surprised that we as a club utilize a Tournament Handicap. Again this is a member that has been playing in our club for over 8 years. Here is an edited version of my response to him:

“The Course Handicap is explained in the Tournament Guide which is posted on the RGC website. We use the lower of a player's GHIN or Tournament Handicap as the Course Handicap. The Tournament Handicap is based on the lowest five of the last 10 scores (differentials) shot in RGC stroke play events at Diamond Oaks.

The mixed tees refer to the different tees played on Diamond Oaks during our tournaments. We even the playing field by comparing the course ratings from each tee. The blues are rated 69.4, the whites 68.1 and the red (women) is 70.9. In our tournaments we use blue as the base, so subtract 1 from the whites and actually add 2 for the women. This is all predicated on the USGA Handicap Manual.”

Not everyone loves the fact that we use a Course Handicap for our events played at Diamond Oaks, but it is fair and even a player who argues that he “concentrates more” during tournaments and that is why his scores are lower actually make my argument for me. If indeed you “concentrate more” and shoot “lower scores” in tournaments then your Tournament Handicap is more indicative of what you would actually shoot in a tournament at Diamond Oaks. I personally love the fact that we use the Course Handicap for our events and know that there aren't any players in the field that have manipulated their GHIN in order to win one of our events. In fact, the only problem with the Tournament Handicap is it does tend to expose players that have a so called “vanity” handicap.

I will be back out on the golf course starting in July after successful shoulder surgery in February. I'll see you all out on the course.

RULES COMMITTEE MESSAGE



We are halfway through another season at the wonderful RGC and I would like to go over the correct way to fill out your scorecard before it is turned in. There have been some issues in the past tournaments.

1. On the personal printed scorecards, there is a spot on the top left above your name to put down the start time.
2. Write the number of strokes you took for each hole. If it was a par 4 and you made a par, write down four. Please do not use +1 or -1 for bogies or birdies. Just the number of strokes for each hole.
3. Add up the total strokes for the front nine and the back nine. Then add those two scores together to get your total.
4. Under your name, there is a place for you to put the end time of your round.

It is important that you check your scores for each hole and add them up correctly before you sign and turn in your scorecard. If they are not filled out correctly and signed, it could result in a disqualification. The people entering the scorecards are not responsible for deciphering any special codes that you use to keep your score.

If anyone has any questions regarding the scorecards feel free to ask.
