Handicapper's Message

Hello all and welcome to another year of golf,

My name is Rick Carter and I am your Handicap chairperson. As a note to all new members and a reminder to existing members, the club will post all tournament scores for you. The club utilizes a tournament handicap to keep the playing field as even and fair as possible. We use a system that compares your tournament index vs your actual USGA index. The formula of the tournament index we use is we take the lowest 2 of the last for tournament differentials, add them together, and divide by 2. This gives a nice snapshot of how an individual is playing in the previous few tournaments and is also fair because it moves scores along quickly if you play regularly.

Another note I would like to share is there have been a few updates to the World Handicapping system for 2024.

Significant updates to the WHS include:

- Inclusion of Shorter-Length Golf Courses Within the Course Rating System: The overall length requirements for Course Rating in the WHS will be significantly reduced. A set of tees on an 18-hole course may be as short as 1,500 yards [1,370 meters] to be eligible for a Course Rating and Slope Rating®, and a set of tees on a 9-hole course may be as short as 750 yards [685 meters]. This change is intended to expand the WHS to thousands of shorter length courses, including par-3 courses, and enable more golfers to obtain and use a Handicap Index.
- Use of an Expected Score for a Hole Not Played: Improvements have been made to the method used to handle holes not played, which will now be based on a player's expected score rather than a score of net par. This new method will produce a 9-hole or 18-hole Score Differential that more accurately reflects a player's ability. As golfers across the world are playing more 9-hole rounds, an expected score can also be used to convert a 9-hole round into an 18-hole Score Differential. For some countries, this means that 9-hole scores will be considered in the calculation of a player's Handicap Index immediately after the day of play, rather than waiting to combine with another 9-hole score.
- · Playing Conditions Calculation Adjustments Made More Frequent: The Playing Conditions Calculation (PCC) has been modified to increase the likelihood of an adjustment for abnormal playing conditions. National associations were given discretion, beginning in July 2022, to introduce this revision within their computation platforms, which will be complete by April 1, 2024.
- Enhanced Guidance on Conducting a Handicap Review: The role of the Handicap Committee is vital to the success of the WHS and the Rules recommend that a Handicap Review is conducted regularly, or at least once a year to ensure a Handicap Index® remains reflective of a player's ability. New reporting tools have been developed that national associations can incorporate into their handicapping software to assist Committees in conducting the review process effectively and consistently.

Happy Golfing and I hope to see you all out swinging the clubs this year!




Tournament Director's Message

Some of the major tournaments require that your tee time is based on score, and I probably will not be able to accommodate you for those tournaments after the first day, but I will do my best.

Tournament Bookkeeper's Message

My name is Harry Wharff. I'm the Tournament Bookkeeper for our club. I'm the person you send your entry fees and skins money to and, if needed, the cancellations for the tournaments. If you need to cancel for a tournament, the money will be refunded back to the way that you paid for that tournament (Memberplanet, Venmo or Zelle). When you sign up and want to get into skins the Fees are \$5 for gross and \$5 for net or \$10 for both. If you are playing in a team event just remember it is team skins and both players need to be in. Please check with your partner if you will be participating in the skins game. For team skins, the fees are \$10 gross and \$10 net or \$20 for both per day for the team (\$40 per team on a two day event for both skins). Also, when you are signing up please include a note indicating what tournament and who you would like to play with. We will try, if possible, to accommodate your request.

We will be changing the app that you will be using to record your scores during play. The app you need to download on App Store for iPhone or Google Store for Android phones is Golfsoftware. This app works the same as previous software, but with more reliability. After you download the app please go in and register with your email. The app will provide you with a password to use for all tournaments. If you cannot get the app to download or set up please see me at the signup table before each tournament. Rules Committee Report

I am your new rules chairperson and have taken an extended leave from the Roseville Golf Club board, last having served as your Handicap Chairman in 2018 under Bryan Lange. I had been on the board for 14 years prior to that, having served as President in 2008. I was ready for a break and it was thoroughly enjoyed. I agreed to serve as the new Rules Chairperson for Ron Foyd, our new President.

My goal this year is to further the work done by past Rules Chairpersons in helping to mark the course for tournaments and to provide insight to the rules of golf in my newsletter articles. Also this year my committee and I will take a look at the local rules and revise those and update them as necessary.

A continuing priority of the Roseville Golf Club is pace of play. All tournament rounds are expected to be completed within 4 and a half hours or within 15 minutes of the group completing play directly ahead of you. Everyone enjoys a comfortable pace of play, but we all have a real issue with a group that has been holding us up all day and then sprints to finish within 15 minutes of the group ahead of them. It makes it double hard on those of us who like to walk the course. So knock it off! We know who you are. Additionally, there is a maximum three (3) minute search time looking for your golf ball. After this 3-minute period expires, the ball is deemed lost. At that point, a Player must take stroke and distance relief by adding one penalty stroke (Rule 14.6). Let's all do our best to play ready golf and keep up with the group ahead of you.

There are no changes to the Rules of Golf for 2024, but there are a few changes to the World Handicapping system, one of which will allow for nine hole scores to immediately be calculated in your daily handicap. I'll let Rick discuss that in more detail.

Remember that if there is a rules dispute in tournament stroke play, a player always has the option of playing two balls. You must announce to your fellow competitors that you are going to play two balls and which ball you intend to use for scoring if the rules allow it and announce that to your marker. Then bring your scorecard in and check with a member of the rules committee BEFORE signing your scorecard and turning it in. We will make a ruling and clarify what your actual tournament score is.
