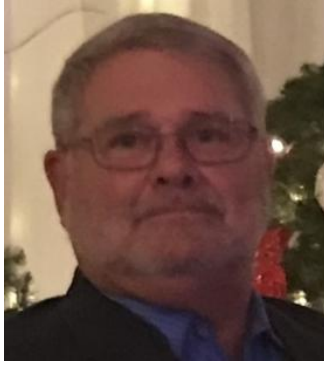
Handicapper's Message

Tournament Director's Message

I will be continuing as Tournament Director for 2026.

Check the 2026 schedule at rosevillegolfclub.com and plan your entry and travel. Invitations for all events will be sent via Golf Genius; after accepting, pay your entry fee and skins (if desired) by Member Planet, Venmo to harry-wharff-1, or Zelle to rgcbkeeper@gmail.com to secure your spot. You'll receive payment confirmation once

processed.

Please list your preferred playing partners on your entry form or contact me with special requests. Tee sheets are assigned based on the player list; if you want an early or late tee time, note it on your entry and I'll try to accommodate. For major tournaments, tee times after the first day are based on scores and requests may not be possible.

1) We will use a group scorecard for each tee time instead of individual cards, (unless a 2-man event) to verify online scores. Please have one player per group use the Golf Genius scoring app.

2) To get the app, search for Golf Genius in your phone's app store (iPhone or Android) and download it. You can setup to use a username and password on the Golf Genius web site via computer or iPad or enter the GGID # from your scorecard on tournament day to score your round. 3) Late entries after the deadline will be waitlisted until a WD spot becomes available.

a. Late entries create extra work for TD, and the tournament handicapper.

b. Signing up early and withdrawing later is preferable to submitting a late entry.

Rules Chairpersons Report



Welcome new and renewing members to the 2026 golf year from Dan McCullough and Steve Hendrickson, your new rules co-chairmen. We are taking over from Ken Lyon who has done an outstanding job over the past two years.

One of Ken's big assignments this past year has been the club's adoption of the new USGA/NCGA optional local rule for dealing with lost ball/out of bounds. This rule is intended to facilitate a faster rate of play and eliminate the "walk of shame" where a player must return to the tee box after having no success locating a shot that likely went out of bounds or is lost. If the foursome agrees that the ball is likely out of bounds, a player must hit a provisional ball from the tee box. In the event that the ball is thought to be in play, but cannot be found, for two penalty strokes you can estimate where your ball is lost or went out of bounds and then find the nearest fairway edge that is not nearer the hole. You can then drop a ball within two club lengths of that fairway edge point, or anywhere between there and the estimated spot where your ball is lost or went out of bounds. If you think your ball might be out of bounds or lost, you should still play a provisional ball to save time, even if the foursome does not agree. You must announce that you are playing a provisional ball before doing so. If you are unable to find your original ball or it is out of bounds, your provisional is your ball in play under stroke and distance. However, you cannot hit a provisional ball and then invoke this rule.

The last of the local rules is perhaps the most important -- that it is the player's responsibility to be familiar with and apply the USGA rules of golf and the local RGC rules to their play. In this regard, we will soon have finalized a copy of our local rules on a card that will be available to all members. Please review the card to familiarize yourself with the club's local rules and keep a copy in your golf bag for reference.
