I have noticed that a few members are sending Jose Salcedo their entry fees though Venmo, after he receives it, then he Venmo's me your entry fee and request a lot of extra work for us. I would prefer members to keep sending your entry fee's and requests to Harry-wharff-1 for Venmo.

Please check the 2026 schedule at rosevillegolfclub.com to plan your entry signup and travel.

Please list your preferred playing partners on your entry form or contact me with special requests. Tee sheets are assigned based on the player list; if you want an early or late tee time, note it on your entry and I'll try to accommodate. (The first 3 tee times are for the tournament Director and helpers for the tournament.) For major tournaments and multi-round tournaments. Tee-times after the first day are based on scores and requests may not be possible.

1) We will use a group scorecard for each tee time instead of individual cards, (unless a 2-man events and match-play events) to verify online scores. Please have one player per group use the Golf Genius scoring app.

2) To get the app, search for Golf Genius in your phone's app store (iPhone or Android) and download it. Enter the GGID # from your scorecard on tournament day to score your round (your GGID # is highlighted in RED on the scorecard). For help, email rgcbkeeper@gmail.com or call 916-599-5178.

3) Late entries after the deadline will be waitlisted until a spot becomes available.

a. Late entries create extra work for TD, and the tournament handicapper.

b. Signing up early and withdrawing later is preferable to submitting a late entry.

Rules Chairpersons Report



With Dan McCullough's recent appointment as our Vice President, I lost my fellow Rules Chairman. Fortunately, Karry Przepiorski, and Jim Espinoza have stepped in to help as members of the Rules Committee. Thank You Karry and Jim!

For this report, I thought I would highlight a rule that can come in handy when a player has a doubt as to how to proceed in the play of a hole. Rule 20.1c allows for the playing of two balls.

To illustrate a Diamond Oaks-type example, suppose your second shot lands in the area of a downed tree. You have doubt as to whether you are allowed relief. So, you may take the following steps under rule 20.1c:

You announce your intent to your fellow player that you are playing two balls;

You declare which ball you want to count as long as the rules allow that ball to be counted;

You finish the hole with both balls; and,

Then report the particulars of the situation to the Rules Committee.

As it turns out, you are allowed free relief under the Abnormal Ground Conditions portion of our local rules which covers relief because your ball landed in the area of the downed tree.

Hope this helps.
